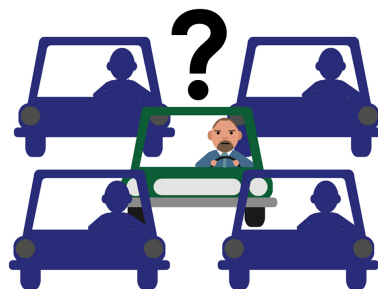


# He Might Be



## Script:

Adam: Good morning!

Tony: Morning! By chance, have you seen Jason today? He's not here yet.

Adam: No, I haven't seen him. He might be stuck in traffic.

Tony: Yeah, but he would've called.

Adam: He might've lost his phone. I'm sure he's not late on purpose. Let's give him ten minutes before we give him a call.

## Grammar:

**Example ONE** Adam: He might be stuck in traffic.

We use "*might be/do/know etc.*" to show that:

- something is possible right now.

Example: There is a red liquid on the floor. What is it? We don't know 100%, so we can only guess.



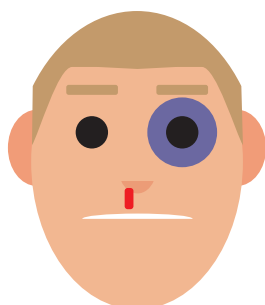
It might be blood.  
It might be ketchup.  
It might be ink.  
It might be paint.  
It might be tomato juice.

**Example TWO** Adam: He might've lost his phone.

We use "*might have (past participle)*" to show that:

- Something possibly happened in the past.

Example: The man has a black eye and a bloody nose. Why? What happened? We don't know 100%, so we can only guess.



He might have been punched.  
He might have been in a car accident.  
He might have been in a boxing match.  
He might be a boxer. (Example ONE)
